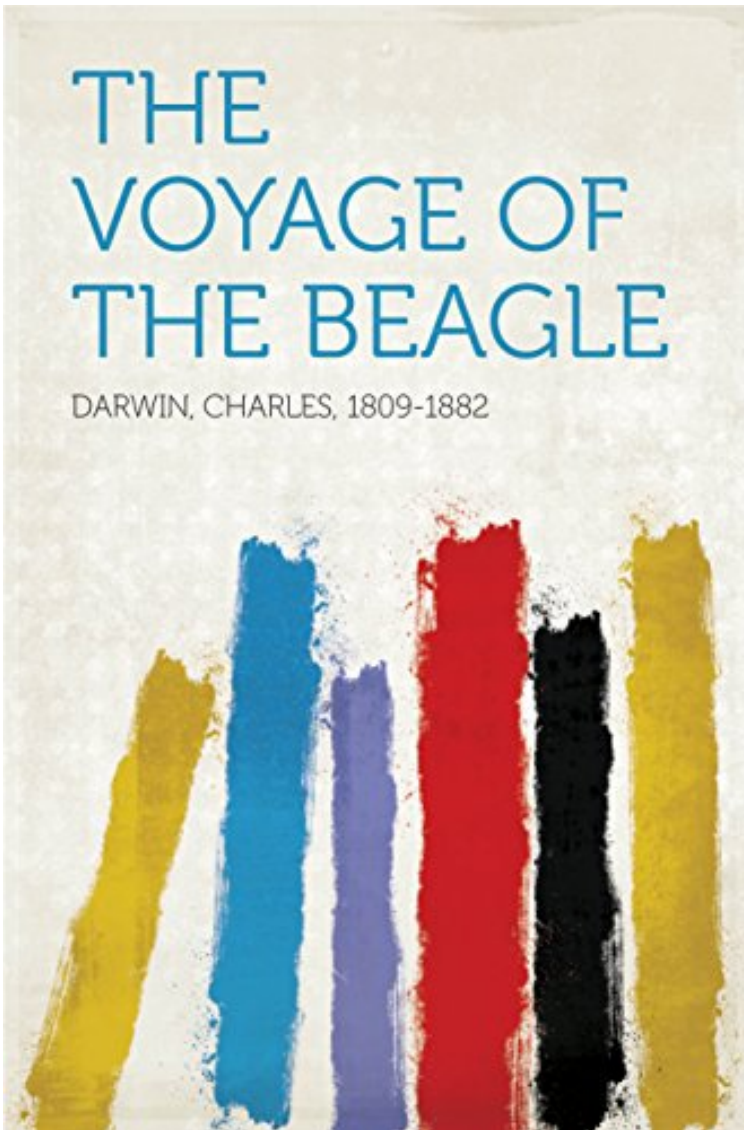

Darwin based many of his conclusions upon his study of the unique creatures of the Galpagos: marine and land iguanas, giant tortoises with a variety of shells, and more than 20 species of finches, each with a distinctive beak.
